Feedback for the essay question:

- 1. The response should include definition and examples of the following:

 Counselors will not be assigned to provide long-term counseling, treatment planning, or long term referrals.

 Counselors will most likely assist first responders who are working with victims by assisting in providing
 - Counselors will most likely assist first responders who are working with victims by assisting in providing basic needs (food, shelter, connection with family members). Counselors may provide assessments of individuals who may be experiencing a crisis to intervene in order to prevent additional crises
- 2. The response should include definition and examples of the following:
 - Counselors in greater risk are those who are in solo practice, do not provide a proper pre-screening prior to scheduling the initial appointment, and work with clients requiring involuntary hospitalization. Counselors should limit personal information on websites and in offices.
- 3. The response should include definition and examples of the following: screening procedures to include medical, mental health, legal history, and presenting issues; having other staff in the office area or during normal office times during initial intakes. Have safety precautions in place prior to an incident occurring.
- 4. The response should include information on the following: office area set up to decrease physical risks, limited information about personal life, remove instruments or objects that could be used as a weapon. If a client leaves who is a risk to self or others, do not attempt to restrict them, rather take note of what they are wearing, in what direction they are leaving, car tags, and contact law enforcement.
